1. The Iowa Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC) is monitoring the situation regarding the novel coronavirus/COVID-19.
2. On March 13, 2020, in an effort to help mitigate the spread of the novel coronavirus/COVID-19, the Commissioner issued an order suspending in-person hearings in regular procedure contested case proceedings before the agency from March 16, 2020, through at least June 16, 2020. The Commissioner's March 13, 2020 Order remains in full effect.
3. The Commissioner is hereby extending the suspension of in-person hearings in regular procedure contested case proceedings before the agency from June 17, 2020, through at least September 14, 2020.
4. All hearing assignment orders that schedule an in-person hearing to occur during the time period identified in Paragraph 3 of this Order are hereby amended with respect to the method of holding the hearing.
5. All in-person hearings before the agency scheduled for the time period identified in Paragraph 3 of this Order shall be held by Internet-based video, using CourtCall, unless the agency grants a continuance under rule 876 IAC 4.23.
6. If, after the date of this Order, the agency grants a continuance under rule 876 IAC 4.23 of an in-person hearing that was originally scheduled to occur during the

time period identified in Paragraph 3 of this Order, the agency shall reschedule the continued hearing to occur:

- a. Between September 15, 2020, and March 15, 2021; and
- b. In Des Moines, Iowa.

7. DWC shall pay all fees associated with conducting a hearing using CourtCall for the time period identified in Paragraph 3 of this Order.

This Order does not amend any hearing assignment order for a telephone hearing concerning an application for alternate care, independent medical examination (IME), etc. Agency procedures regarding these hearings remain unchanged. They will continue to take place via telephone. However, if a party requests an in-person hearing instead of a telephone hearing to take place during the time period identified in Paragraph 3 of this Order, the hearing will be held via Internet-based video, using CourtCall.

10. As circumstances change, this Order may be updated.
